Editorial policy

GEOHORIZONS is the flagship journal of the Society of Petroleum Geophysicists (SPG), India, and invites technical and review articles for publication that are relevant to the oil and gas industry. Article submissions for publication in GEOHORIZONS can be made by members as well as non-members of SPG.

Contributions can be in the form of original research papers, tutorials, review articles, or case studies. Manuscripts on fundamental geophysical principles that are relevant for exploration are also invited. Authors who may have presented their research work at the SPG biennial conferences could rewrite their expanded abstracts by following the guidelines for authors given. Articles with a liberal dose of mathematical equations should be accompanied with a pdf file showing the equations in their correct form, including specific fonts, etc. and position.

All paper submissions to GEOHORIZONS should be original subject to the following guidelines:

1. The paper should not have been submitted to or is being considered for publication by any other journal. Only if the already submitted paper is of limited public viewership, the editorial board of GEOHORIZONS can take a call for accepting its publication.
2. Extension of an earlier piece of research work by another author, or a tutorial, or a review could be considered for publication.
3. In case of similarity between an original and extension work, the overlap of material from a self-sourced published work should be clearly indicated by the author. The Editorial Board will reserve the right to allow such work based on healthy overlap between the original and extensional work.
4. Information content included in an article that is borrowed from some work published elsewhere beyond what is permitted by the publisher will need formal permission/acknowledgement. It will be the lead author's responsibility to obtain such permission and include it in the submitted article. 5. Any infringement of copyright arising from publication of submitted papers will be the sole responsibility of the authors, and not GEOHORIZONS or SPG.

Besides the mainstream technical feature articles, SPG members are encouraged to submit news related to the different professional societies affiliated to SPG, which may consist of a brief write-up and some photographs. For providing suggestions for improvement of the publication or to provide any other kind of feedback, SPG members can send their comments to the Editor. The relevant suggestions will be included under the '*Letters to the editor*' column.

Guidelines to authors

1. The authors are advised to follow the guidelines mentioned below in the interest of quick processing of their submissions.
2. The text should be printed in MS Word with Times New Roman/Calibri font size 12 and single spacing.
3. All figures and photographs should be submitted as PowerPoint slides, or as high-resolution (300 dpi) images in .tiff or .png formats, and as separate files.
4. Tables may be submitted in MS Excel format.
5. References included in the text must be complete and be following the following format:

6. Captions for the individual figures should be included as text at the end of the references for the main article.
7. Brief biographies for the authors and their photos should also be submitted along with their article.
8. As stated above, permission for use of figures or any information from published work is the sole responsibility of the authors. SPG should not be expected to seek any such permission from anywhere.
9. The author(s) may include a written statement with their submission saying ‘the submitted article is an original piece of work carried out by the authors and not copied from anywhere. Also, the submitted work has not been published previously, nor submitted for publication to any other journal. If it has been presented in any SPG/other conference as an abstract, it should be intimated.
